

With the 2016 sailing season coming to a close, it's been an honor serving as your Commodore. We hosted three regattas on Lake Harriet this year including the high profile ILYA MC Invite. All of these events relied on the exceptional volunteerism that makes LHYC special. We also rely heavily on the TCSC members and are very thankful that we have them as a partner.

This was the first year that we designed our fee structure to target the multiple programs that LHYC provides. Our Adaptive team added another boat to their fleet along with new members who helped out on their sailing nights. The new Heuer lift at the dock now transports a person into a boat in 5 to 10 minutes versus the 30 minutes of years past. The cooperation and help from the Minneapolis Park Board has been crucial to putting this new hoist to work.

Our Youth team keeps growing and this year our Wednesday Night races included their 420's many evenings. It's fun to watch the kids having fun in their boats. These are kids that will remain friends for years to come and, hopefully be active racers in the M or MC fleets. We hosted a table at the Lynnhurst Neighborhood Festival and many asked about our program and how they could get their kids involved.

The MC racing is getting more competitive every week. Just 1.7 points separated 1st & 2nd place. 3rd, 4th & 5th place were separated by 5 points. Ten different racers won races this past year for the MC racers and almost all the racers, including this Gold Medal wannabe, had top 10 finishes. When you compare the number of LHYC racers on the line with other clubs in the ILYA, we are near the top for the number of people at the line on our little lake. Our M-16 team has also been very active with Joe Schroeder taking part in the M Nationals in New Jersey. LHYC received many compliments at the MC Invite for our lake, our club and all of the people involved. As a testament to this work and a capstone to this fantastic year on Lake Harriet, **the Inland Lakes Yachting Association awarded LHYC its 2016 Club of the Year Award.**

WOMEN'S CLINIC *Jennifer Bowers & Cynthia Callanan*

The LHYC Women's Sailing Clinic is an annual tradition that has been running for over 15 years. Our goal is community outreach – to create an opportunity for women who are intrigued by sailing to give it a try in a very welcoming, comfortable environment. This year we had 25 women participate in the clinic, plus 8 volunteers from LHYC and TCSC! The women participating ranged from teenagers to 60-somethings, and included 3 women of color, and a couple of mother/daughter pairs. The diversity was inspiring! We went over some sailing basics on shore: boat parts, points of sail, and how to tack. Then we matched participants up with our wonderful volunteer women skippers, and got everyone out sailing. The wind was very light on July 10th, so our newbie sailors had to exercise patience to be able to practice sailing in a straight line and tacking, but they all were able to do it. Over brownies and lemonade after sailing, we shared information about the range of sailing opportunities for new sailors in the metro area. Not every clinic participant continues sailing, but we have several TCSC sailors who began with the women's clinic, and are now skippers, and sometimes crew during LHYC races. So, another big thank you to our volunteers!

2016 ILYA MC INVITATIONAL REGATTA

hosted by LHYC August 15–17

It was the realization of a dream for us to host an ILYA regatta at Lake Harriet. 48 MC's competed, representing 6 states and 14 lakes. We thank all of the sailors for making the trip to join us. Big kudos to the Race Committee, Mark Prange, Debbie Prange, Peter Wattson, Jeff Millar, Wendy Ott, and Bill Hanson for rising to the challenge of classic Lake Harriet shifty wind conditions.

The 2016 MC Invite was a slight departure from typical regattas as 12 35-minute races were scheduled for the regatta. The high number of races created sufficient fleet separation, while maximizing the number of starts. While there were some close finishes, the racing was fair and everyone had fun.

Friday greeted us with sunny weather and no wind. A morning of catching up with old friends wrapped up with a productive fleet meeting run by Mark Tesar. After lunch a bit of breeze settled in and our 48-boat fleet headed out for a dose of shifty light-air sailing. Two good races were sailed, and the third was abandoned after some 120 degree shifts followed by the wind

dropping to nothing. Friday night brought us perfect weather for a beautiful picnic at Beard's Plaisance. With just two races under our belts, there was an air of anticipation, with everyone looking forward to the coming two days of predicted 10 mph winds.

Saturday morning we were greeted by a bit more steady wind. We ended up sailing 5 races and saw some major changes in the standings with the most consistent sailors steadily rising to the top of the scoresheet. Saturday night's party was held at local restaurant Urban Eatery, and also celebrated **LHYC's 75th anniversary**. Old LHYC yearbooks were passed around, and the trophies for the regatta were getting everyone excited for the last day of sailing.

Sunday brought even more breeze, and we sailed two races in a breeze that eventually built to 15 mph. In the end we completed 9 races. The top three sailors - Dan Quiram (2621), Dan Guidinger (2653), and Ryan Grosch (2169) - all stood out, but it was Ryan Grosch's consistency that paid off as he took 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in the last three races of the regatta.

The other top sailors are as follows: First Junior: Ryan Grosch; First Woman: Emily Oltrogge (2340); First Master: Dan Guidinger; and First Grand Master: Dave Mott (2121).

ADAPTIVE SAILING PROGRAM

2016 WAS A GREAT YEAR FOR ADAPTIVE SAILING, WE ADDED:

- Another boat to our fleet (6 in total)
- A new heavy-duty sailor lift
- Additional sailors and volunteers.

Our new sailboat Enamorado came with a trailer with an awesome extendable tongue that makes boat launching and take-out a snap; we no longer need to take the lead out while on the water! The 15 foot extension gets the trailer into deep water so the boat can just float into place. A big thank you goes to Terry Hanson for again making a cross-country trip to pick up the 3rd boat – this one came from Pennsylvania.

After much hard work by key sailors and volunteers, a plate was designed to hold a new electric lift semi-permanently to the City's floating dock. A big thank you goes to the Mpls Park Board for working with us to add accessibility to a wider range of sailors by installing the electric lift plate. The lift is more secure and easier to use for both sailors and volunteers.

2017 GOALS

- Design and build 2 lifts to hold the 6 boats and protect them from bumping damage while at the buoy
- Continue to make new sailing friends and have fun
- Sail more

The season began in February at Joe and Karen Schroeder's house with a pot luck mid-winter party for parents and kids. The weather was super warm and allowed us to spend most of the time on the back deck enjoying sunshine, grilling food, and being treated to teen pop music on the boom box. We also discussed plans for the year including coordination of Calhoun summer camps, 420 racing, and the overall schedule.

The generosity of volunteers and supporters continues to define the club's success. On fundraising, Bill Hansen was the clear winning bid at last year's auction at banquet for the historic wooden LHYC sign, Joanna Lees made a donation, we received a donation from the O'Brien foundation, the Netzer's donated a set of new 420 sails, and the Jim Morgan memorial made significant contributions. races. Special thanks to PRO Jennifer Bowers, assistant Martha Long, scorekeeper Jamie Fraser, Lisa Netzer and Andy Beauchamp on registration, and Bill Kirkpatrick for bringing over a Calhoun safety boat.

This year marked the second year of the Club 420 race series. Sharing the course with the scows on Wednesday evenings, five different skippers and their crew completed eight races with each skipper winning at least one race. The Optimist fleet grew with new members and increased participation. It was great to see the younger sailors become more independent and confident on the water.

Growth remains our key opportunity with more capacity than kids. Jamie Fraser hosted a booth at the Lynnhurst neighborhood festival and drew in lots of interest.
