

On most weekday evenings and virtually every weekend day, LHYC volunteers were supporting and coordinating the activities of the Adaptive Sailing, Youth Sailing, and Racing Programs. Well before the start of the sailing season, volunteers from LHYC and the Twin Cities Sailing Club assembled and operated Rocky, a manually rocked sailboat simulator, for this year's Art Shanty Project held on ice-covered Lake Harriet.

LHYC volunteers hosted three events that attached numerous off-lake participants: a Twin Cities Youth Sailing regatta, the 2018 M16 North American Championship, and the Die Hard Regatta. Social events featuring ample opportunities for exchanging sailing yarns were hosted by the Colburn, Bowers, O'Brien-Bastyr, Seymour, Amesbury-Schroeder, Ott, and Terry Hanson households.

The LHYC equipment inventory had several improvements this year including the purchase of new sails for the Adaptive Program's boats, a new safety boat, a new outboard motor, new towing bridles for the safety boats, and other upgrades. In terms of replacing lost or damaged equipment, I am delighted to report that no hand-held hailers and no radios were dropped overboard.

As a participant in LHYC's Racing Program, I would also like to thank my fellow competitors for fair, challenging, and enjoyable sailboat racing. I appreciate both your racing skills and sportsmanship.

The season began on a frozen Lake Harriet volunteering at the TCSC/LHYC ice shanty in January. Dedicated and well layered sailors setup an Optimist, handed out flyers, and let kids pretend sail while promoting youth sailing. Kites were flown and snowballs made. The afternoon was wrapped up with a warm-up social at the Schroeder's home with hot chocolate and cookies.

Tuesday sailing was a big hit this year with an over 50% increase in participation from last year. This was in part due to new members, but also sailors bringing their friends and neighbors to join the fun. In addition to the ever popular free sailing, Bill Colburn led some fun sailing games (the cone drill), Bill Kirkpatrick loaned his giant floating mat for a low-wind swimming day, and we held the 2nd annual search for floating fruit scattered across the lake. Mickey was the big winner with 13 points followed closely by Charlotte with 12 points. The parents had fun dropping fruit across the lake while using GPS waypoints to track oranges, bananas, mangoes, and watermelon.

This year we hosted the Twin Cities Youth Sailing Optimist regatta on Lake Harriet on Friday July 13th. We had great wind and 25 sailors participating in over five races. Special thanks to PROs Joe Friction and Chris Seymour with help from youth

sailors and Chuck Ott, plus registration and lunch by Lisa and Maddy Netzer.

Jamie Fraser continued to organize the Wednesday night 420 races. A small but dedicated group kept the races going through the summer plus new racers Abby Tapajna and Elliot Aust. Maddy took the trophy again thanks to great sailing and participation. New for this year is "top crew award" based on boat score when crewing. Maeve was undefeated and took top honors. Both her crew and skipper skills were greatly improved over last year. Madeline, Maeve, and Helene also sailed for Varsity High School Sailing at Minneapolis Sailing Center for their respective high school teams, a bonus for the other youth sailors who benefit from the skills they bring to the lake.

We wrapped up the year with a parent & sailor meeting to discuss how to continue improving the program. A good list of programming improvements was made, plus a slightly intimidating equipment and boat update plan. But it is heartening to know how much support we will have through the dedicated parents and other volunteers. This is the strength of this program, a great example of community engagement for the young sailors.

Another fantastic Die Hard regatta, with 36 MCs and 3 Ms registered. We also had 13 off-lake sailors. Joe Fricton was PRO, assisted by RO Bill Hanson, scorekeeper Betsy Hasselman, and general assistant Lucas Fricton. On Saturday, five races were scheduled. With a steady South 15-20mph wind, Bill Colburn was consistent winning four races. Due to the gusty conditions, several boats capsized and turtled, including several within 200 feet of the finish line. On Sunday, the wind shifted to E/SE and 5-10mph. The fleet was a bit more aggressive, with PRO Fricton flying Z and Black flags on several starts. As the wind changed, Grosch and Darin Newman sailed very fast, but they could not make up for Colburn's Saturday consistency.
