The race is a challenge. Our closest competitors are always pushing us to improve, to perform at our best. So, we're not just racing AGAINST one another, we're competing WITH one another. In this way, the race is collegial. We honor each other by doing our best. Here at LHYC, our best comes with a high degree of sportsmanship.

I consider myself extremely fortunate to be able to sail, to race, and to do it in the incredible community that is the Lake Harriet Yacht Club. 2019 has been another tremendous year, sharing this sport and these experiences that we love. Let's do it again next year. I would love that.

YOUTH SAILING PROGRAM

The 2019 season started early for youth sailing. With snow still on the ground, we replaced all the lines and sails on six optimists with the help of a few parents and sailors. While thunderstorms kept us off the water a few times, we were still able to make the most of weather-friendly Tuesday nights. Most Tuesdays saw three to six Optimists on the water and one or two 420s. It was great to see all the sailors improving their skills and confidence on the water.

The Optimists were a dynamic fleet this year. We saw great talent from all the sailors, with Mickey Fraser being one of the most consistent sailors and surest hands on the tiller. Charlie Fricton had his first sail on an Optimist, and we were happy to see the return of Elin Wellmann and Ava Armbrustmacher. While most of the evenings involved free sailing, the scavenger hunt in August was a big hit. Sailors collected words from various points on the lake to bring a full-sentence back to the dock.

This is my seventh and final year leading the youth program. Unfortunately, work conflicts prevented me from joining on Tuesday nights this year, thanks to Lisa Netzer and Jennifer Bowers for leading group sailing and writing the year's summary above. In these seven years, we doubled the 420 fleet, replaced half the optimists, replaced half the 420 and all the optimist sails and lines, built a youth shed (Will Kirkpatrick), built an Aluminum

420 lift (John Katics), formalized skipper / boat check-out procedures, and continued expanding sailing games and activities. This enabled growth in the club, especially as the Optimist sailors moved into 420s. All of this was made possible by the parents and other volunteers who helped on and off the lake. Starting next year, Jennifer Bowers will lead the program, both her and Mike have lots of sailing and instruction experience, the program will be in good hands!

The ultimate success of the program is not just measured by how many sailors return each year, but ironically also by those sailors who do not. While Maddy Netzer, Helene Schroeder, and Maeve Katics have come less frequently, they have moved to high school sailing in spring and fall, some moving up to Laser racing, plus Wednesday racing and recreational sailing on Ensigns. Maeve and Maddy have also moved into leadership positions as junior instructors at Minneapolis Sailing Center. Emma Netzer hopes to sail in college next year, as do others in the future. Ultimately, the story of saving sailing is not defined by attendance numbers or wins on the course, but how each youth sailor carries their sailing experience forward as a lifelong recreation in their own way.

DOLORES’ LEMON BARS

Crust: 1/3 C butter, 1/4 C granulated sugar, 1 C flour

Filling: 2 eggs, 3/4 C granulated sugar, 2 tbs flour, 2 tsp grated lemon peel, 3 tbs lemon juice, 1/4 tsp baking powder

1 – In a mixing bowl, beat butter until smooth and combine with 1/4 C sugar. Beat in 1 C flour until crumbly. Press mixture into the bottom of an

ungreased 8x8x2 baking pan. Bake at 350F for 15-18 minutes until golden.

2 – For the filling, mix all ingredients listed and beat for 2 minutes until combined.

3 – Pour filling over baked layer. Bake 20 minutes more or until lightly browned around the edges and center is set. Sift powdered sugar over the top once cooled.
