The Adaptive program had five boats on the lake in 2025. There were nine individual sailors and 21 different volunteers throughout the summer and our group was able to sail 15 out of 20 scheduled nights this year. We lost 2 long time volunteers (Ric Anderson and Karen Hemstad) in which memorials were shared with the program. Karen's memorials today are over \$3,000. We will be sponsoring a bench at the bandshell in her memory which her sons and husband will help over the winter to work out the language. The remaining donations for both Karen and Ric will be used for new sails, new lines and repairs.

In the future we are planning to engage with TCSC to identify philanthropic members who love sailing and would like to join our team for the long term health of the program. Our sailors continue to spread the word as they meet interested potential sailors, living with disabilities. We have a subgroup of LHYC engineering types working with Wendy and Ted on a new buoy/lift system that is usable by most people's capabilities.

It was a great summer with a lot of community and camaraderie around the picnic table. Once the boats were put away. We had dinner together one night and lots of chatting and laughter every week. One of our veteran sailors, at the potluck at Terry Hanson's, shared with the group that this program has changed her life significantly and shared her gratitude for the work of all the volunteers.

Others continued to shine as they both increased their sailing skills and mentored other sailors. Zuzu Welle was always willing to take on a new crew and show them the ropes. Nick Grimm, Amelia Colburn, Quincy Aust, and Julian Pogemiller continued to be inspiring and kind sailors and leaders to the next generation. They all regularly make an effort to include younger and less experienced sailors, helping them get comfortable on the water. Nick took youth sailors out on his new MC while Amelia did the same on the Team Colburn M15.

While we had our share of lightening delays and light wind evenings, the kids made the best of those nights by playing on the rafts, filming scenes for our movie and building their friendships.

We sincerely appreciate the club's and all the parent's support each evening with launch & recovery, safety and for going along with whatever crazy theme is happening. 2025 Die Hard Regatta – Event Summary: A last-minute schedule change meant the fall regatta was a one-day event this year: the celebrations of life event for Harper Moyski occupied the bandshell and the park on the Sunday of our scheduled event. Despite the abbreviated event, Saturday had six races, moderate breeze, and classic Lake Harriet camaraderie.

MC Scow Fleet—The 20-boat MC fleet delivered tight racing and plenty of reshuffling throughout the day. Ryan Grosch put together a steady 3-2-2-1-3-1 scoreline to secure the overall win

with 9 points. Behind him, the battle for the podium was fierce with close scores for the rest of the five trophy places. Eric Wellmann rebounded from a tough first race to post a string of top finishes and take second. Bob Christie sailed a solid, even series, finishing in third. Joe Fricton opened the day with a bullet and finished fourth overall. Dan Guidinger, representing White Bear, stayed in the hunt all day and finished fifth.

Melges 15 Fleet—The Melges 15 fleet continues to grow in depth and speed. Darin and Kara Newman led the regatta from the third race on, winning the regatta with 8 points. Their ability to stay at the front in shifting conditions set the tone for the day. Steve Johanson & Mollie Boswell of Minnetonka claimed second with 14 points, highlighted by a win in Race 1. Close behind, Mike & Theo Bowers took third with 16 points, including a win in Race 2.

A One-Day Regatta to Remember— Even with the unexpected schedule change, the 2025 Die Hard Regatta captured everything that makes fall sailing on our lake special: strong fleets, friendly competition, and an evening party (at Pam Johnson's home) with good humor when the lake — or the park — throws a curveball. Thanks to all sailors, volunteers, and race committee members who made the compressed format work smoothly. The day was full, the racing was lively, and the spirit of the event was true to Lake Harriet.

Over the years Ric sailed, owned and partnered in numerous sailboats locally, on Lake Superior, the Caribbean island chain and the North Atlantic. In 2001 he had logged enough sea time and knowledge to qualify and test to become a US Coast Guard Merchant Marine Master Captain with a 50-ton rating. He introduced many, many friends to the thrill and joy of sailing and taught advanced sailing classes on Lake Superior through the American Sailing Association. Ric was a long-time committed volunteer and drove up from Mankato with his wife every Monday for a number of years and was integral to the LHYC Adaptive volunteer team. They, also, enjoyed sailboat racing on Lake Minnetonka.
